1. When assigning positions to the deck, we would like the above set-up to be utilized S & T on each end. NO Stroke Official Walking Sides.
2. Each Official would have Jurisdiction for half the pool.
3. Please utilized a Chief Judges as much as possible, they will help the meet run smoother and faster
4. The most experience person on deck should be the Referee, it doesn't matter whether it's the home or the visiting team official.
5. The Starter should be the most experience starter whether it's the home or visiting team. Starting is an art and should be handled by the best person.
6. The Chief Judge should be very experienced and will be responsible for bringing DQ slips to the Ref for his/her signature.
7. If possible have a Chief Judge on each end of the pool. It's more important to have a Chief Judge than to have a full deck of S & T officials. It will make the meet run faster and smoother.

Goals of Each Meet
