FACILITY: The pool is a six-lane, twenty-five meter facility with starting blocks, non-turbulent lane lines, and water starts are not required from shallow end of pool. Facility has locker rooms, and ample parking.

DIRECTIONS: From the east – enter Seaford on Delaware Route 20. Turn right on Route 13. At the second traffic light (intersection landmark – McDonald’s and Friendly’s). turn left onto Stein Highway. Follow Stein Highway through seven traffic lights to the Nylon Capitol Shopping Center. Turn left past light onto McKean Avenue. At the stop sign continue straight across to the club parking lot.

From the west – turn right off of Route 20 just before the Nylon Capitol Shopping Center onto Sussex Avenue. Proceed one and one half blocks to the pool.

From the north - head south on Route 13 to Seaford at the second traffic light (intersection landmark – McDonald’s and Friendly’s). turn right onto Stein Highway. Follow Stein Highway through seven traffic lights to the Nylon Capitol Shopping Center. Turn left past light onto McKean Avenue. At the stop sign continue straight across to the club parking lot.

From the south - head north on Route 13 to Seaford at the third traffic light (intersection landmark – McDonald’s and Friendly’s). turn left onto Stein Highway. Follow Stein Highway through seven traffic lights to the Nylon Capitol Shopping Center. Turn left past light onto McKean Avenue. At the stop sign continue straight across to the club parking lot.

HISTORY: The Seaford Gulf and Country pool opened in 1974 and developed the swimming program. SG&CC had been a major competitor in the Delmarva Swim Association. In 2009 SGCC closed and the City of Seaford purchased the property in 2010 and a non-profit board of volunteers was formed to partner with the City to operate the pool. Upon organizing the board re-named the pool Seaford Community Swim Center. Our goal is to instill enthusiasm, commitment and pride in the individual swimmer, in the team, and for the sport of swimming. The SCSC fields a team of 30 –40 swimmers.
